8 For we do not want you to be ignorant, brethren, of the affliction we experienced in Asia; for we were so utterly, unbearably crushed that we despaired of life itself.	
9 Why, we felt that we had received the sentence of death; but that was to make us rely not on ourselves but on <u>God</u> who	

raises the dead;

- 10 he delivered us from so deadly a peril, and he will deliver us; on him we have set our hope that he will deliver us again.
- 11 You also must help us by prayer, so that many will give thanks on our behalf for the blessing granted us in answer to many prayers.
- 12 For our boast is this, the testimony of our conscience that we have behaved in the world, and still more toward you, with holiness and godly sincerity, not by earthly wisdom but by the grace of <u>God</u>.
- 13 For we write you nothing but what you can read and understand; I hope you will understand fully,

14a as you have understood in part, that you can be proud of us as we can be of you, on the Day 14b [...].

15 Because I was sure of this, I wanted to come to you first, so that you might have a double pleasure;

16 I wanted to visit you on my way to Macedonia, and to come back to you from Macedonia and have you send me on my way to Judea.

- 17 Was I vacillating when I wanted to do this? Do I make my plans like a worldly man, ready to say Yes and No at once?

22 He has put his seal upon us and given us his <u>Spirit</u> in our hearts as a guarantee.	
23 But I call <u>God</u> to witness against meit was to spare you that I refrained from coming to Corinth.	
24 Not that we lord it over your faith; we work with you for your joy, for you stand firm in your faith.	
2:1 For I made up my mind not to make you another painful visit.	
2 For if I cause you pain, who is there to make me glad but the one whom I have pained?	
3 And I wrote as I did, so that when I came I might not suffer pain from those who should have made me rejoice, for I felt sure of all of you, that my joy would be the joy of you all.	
4 For I wrote you out of much affliction and anguish of heart and with many tears, not to cause you pain but to let you know the abundant love that I have for you.	
5 But if any one has caused pain, he has caused it not to me, but in some measurenot to put it too severelyto you all.

5 Not that we are competent of ourselves to claim anything as coming from us; our competence is from <u>God</u> ,	
6 who has made us competent to be ministers of a new covenant, not in a written code but in the <u>Spirit</u> ; for the written code kills, but the <u>Spirit</u> gives life.	
7 Now if the dispensation of death, carved in letters on stone, came with such splendor that the Israelites could not look at Moses' face because of its brightness, fading as this was,	
8 will not the dispensation of the <u>Spirit</u> be attended with greater splendor?	
9 For if there was splendor in the dispensation of condemnation, the	

dispensation of righteousness must far exceed it in splendor.	
10 Indeed, in this case, what once had splendor has come to have no splendor at all, because of the splendor that surpasses it.	
11 For if what faded away came with splendor, what is permanent must have much more splendor.	
12 Since we have such a hope, we are very bold,	
13 not like Moses, who put a veil over his face so that the Israelites might not see the end of the fading splendor.	
14a But their minds were hardened; 14b [].	14b for to this day, when they read the old covenant, that same veil remains unlifted, because only through <u>Christ</u> is it taken away
15 Yes, to this day whenever Moses is read a veil lies over their minds;	a way

2 For he says, "At the acceptable time I have listened to you, and helped you on the day of salvation.(Is 49:8)" Behold, now is the acceptable time; behold, now is the day of salvation.	

3 - 10 [...]. 3 We put no obstacle in any one's way, so that no fault may be found with our ministry, 4 but as servants of God we commend ourselves in every way: through great endurance, in afflictions, hardships, calamities, 5 beatings, imprisonments, tumults, labors, watching, hunger; 6 by purity, knowledge, forbearance, kindness, the Holy Spirit, genuine love, 7 truthful speech, and the power of God; with the weapons of righteousness for the right hand and for the left; 8 in honor and dishonor, in ill repute and good repute. We are treated as impostors, and yet are true; 9 as unknown, and yet well known; as dying, and behold we live; as punished, and yet not killed; 10 as sorrowful, yet always rejoicing; as poor, yet making many rich; as having nothing, and yet possessing everything 11 Our mouth is open to you, Corinthians; our heart is wide. 12 You are not restricted by us, but you are restricted in your own affections. 13 In return--I speak as to children--widen your hearts also. 14 Do not be mismated with unbelievers. 14 - 16a [...]; For what partnership have righteousness and iniquity? Or what fellowship has light with darkness?

	15 What accord has <u>Christ</u> with Belial? Or what has a believer in common with an unbeliever?
	16a What agreement has the temple of God with idols? For we are the temple of the living God
16b as <u>God</u> said, "I will live in them and move among them, and I will be their <u>God</u> , and they shall be my people. (Lev 26:12)"	
17 Therefore "come out from them, and be separate from them, says (the) <u>LORD</u> , and touch nothing unclean (Is 52:11);" "then I will welcome you (Eze 20:34),"	
18 and "I will be a father" (2 Sam 7:8) to you, "and" you "shall be my sons" (Is 43:6) and daughters, "says (the) <u>LORD</u> Almighty (Jer 31:9)."	
7:1 [].	7:1 Since we have these promises, beloved, let us cleanse ourselves from every defilement of body and spirit, and make holiness perfect in the fear of God
2 Open your hearts to us; we have wronged no one, we have corrupted no one, we have taken advantage of no one.	
3 I do not say this to condemn you, for I said before that you are in our hearts, to die together and to live together.	
4 I have great confidence in you; I have great pride in you; I am filled with comfort. With all our affliction, I am overjoyed.

16 I rejoice, because I have perfect confidence in you.

2 for in a severe test of affliction, their abundance of joy and their extreme poverty have overflowed in a wealth of liberality on their part.	
3 For they gave according to their means, as I can testify, and beyond their means, of their own free will,

- 9 For you know the grace of our <u>Lord</u> <u>Jesus Christ</u>, that though he was rich, yet for your sake he became poor, so that by his poverty you might become rich
- 10 And in this matter I give my advice: it is best for you now to complete what a year ago you began not only to do but to desire,
- 11 so that your readiness in desiring it may be matched by your completing it out of what you have.
- 12 For if the readiness is there, it is acceptable according to what a man has, not according to what he has not.
- 13 I do not mean that others should be eased and you burdened,
- 14 but that as a matter of equality your abundance at the present time should supply their want, so that their abundance may supply your want, that there may be equality.
- 15 As it is written, "He who gathered much had nothing over, and he who gathered little had no lack" (Ex 16:18).
- 16 But thanks be to <u>God</u> who puts the same earnest care for you into the heart of Titus.
- 17 For he not only accepted our appeal, but being himself very earnest he is going to you of his own accord.
- 18 With him we are sending the brother who is famous among all the churches for his preaching of the good news;

19a and not only that, but he has been appointed by the churches to travel with us in this gracious work which we are carrying on,

19b [] 19c and to show our good will.	19b for the glory of the <u>Lord</u>
20 We intend that no one should blame us about this liberal gift which we are administering,	
21 for "we aim at what is honorable not only in (the) <u>LORD</u> 's sight but also in the sight of men" (Prov 3:4 LXX).	
22 And with them we are sending our brother whom we have often tested and found earnest in many matters, but who is now more earnest than ever because of his great confidence in you.	
23a As for Titus, he is my partner and fellow worker in your service; and as for our brethren, they are messengers of the churches, 23b [].	23b the glory of <u>Christ</u>
24 So give proof, before the churches, of your love and of our boasting about you to these men.	
9:1 Now it is superfluous for me to write to you about the offering for the saints,

- 7 Each one must do as he has made up his mind, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for "God loves a cheerful giver" (Prov 22:8 LXX).
- 8 And <u>God</u> is able to provide you with every blessing in abundance, so that you may always have enough of everything and may provide in abundance for every good work.
- 9 As it is written, "He scatters abroad, he gives to the poor; his righteousness endures for ever" (Psa 112:9).
- 10 He who supplies seed to the sower and bread for food will supply and multiply your resources and increase the harvest of your righteousness.
- 11 You will be enriched in every way for great generosity, which through us will produce thanksgiving to <u>God</u>;
- 12 for the rendering of this service not only supplies the wants of the saints but also overflows in many thanksgivings to God.
- 13a Under the test of this service, you will glorify God by your obedience in acknowledging the good news
  13b [...],

13c and by the generosity of your contribution for them and for all others;

13b of Christ

14 while they long for you and pray for you, because of the surpassing grace of God in you.	
15 Thanks be to <u>God</u> for his inexpressible gift!	
10:1a I, Paul, myself entreat you with meekness and gentleness 1b [] 1c(I) who am humble when face to face with you, but bold to you when I am away!	1b of <u>Christ</u>
2 I beg of you that when I am present I may not have to show boldness with such confidence as I count on showing against some who suspect us of acting in worldly fashion.	
3 For though we live in the world we are not carrying on a worldly war,

- 9 I would not seem to be frightening you with letters.
- 10 For they say, "His letters are weighty and strong, but his bodily presence is weak, and his speech of no account."
- 11 Let such people understand that what we say by letter when absent, we do when present.
- 12 Not that we venture to class or compare ourselves with some of those who commend themselves. But when they measure themselves by one another, and compare themselves with one another, they are without understanding.
- 13 But we will not boast beyond limit, but will keep to the limits <u>God</u> has apportioned us, to reach even to you.
- 14a For we are not overextending ourselves, as though we did not reach you; we were the first to come all the way to you with the good news 14b [...].
- 15 We do not boast beyond limit, in other men's labors; but our hope is that as your faith increases, our field among you may be greatly enlarged,
- 16 so that we may preach the good news in lands beyond you, without boasting of work already done in another's field.

6 Even if I am unskilled in speaking, I am not in knowledge; in every way we have made this plain to you in all things.

8 I robbed other churches by accepting support from them in order to serve you.	
9 And when I was with you and was in want, I did not burden any one, for my needs were supplied by the brethren who	

came from Macedonia. So I refrained and will refrain from burdening you in any way.

10a As the truth

10c is in me, this boast of mine shall not be silenced in the regions of Achaia.

- 11 And why? Because I do not love you? God knows I do!
- 12 And what I do I will continue to do, in order to undermine the claim of those who would like to claim that in their boasted mission they work on the same terms as we do.

- 16 I repeat, let no one think me foolish; but even if you do, accept me as a fool, so that I too may boast a little.
- 17 (What I am saying I say not with the Lord's authority but as a fool, in this boastful confidence:
- 18 since many boast of worldly things, I too will boast.)
- 19 For you gladly bear with fools, being wise yourselves!
- 20 For you bear it if a man makes slaves of you, or preys upon you, or takes advantage

- 13 For such men are false apostles, deceitful workmen, disguising themselves as apostles of Christ.

- 28 And, apart from other things, there is the daily pressure upon me of my anxiety for all the churches.

- 30 If I must boast, I will boast of the things that show my weakness.
