<p>12 I am sending him back to you, sending my very heart.</p> <p>13 I would have been glad to keep him with me, in order that he might serve me on your behalf during my imprisonment for the good news;</p> <p>14 but I preferred to do nothing without your consent in order that your goodness might not be by compulsion but of your own free will.</p> <p>15 Perhaps this is why he was parted from you for a while, that you might have him back for ever,</p> <p>16 no longer as a slave but more than a slave, as a beloved brother, especially to me but how much more to you, both in the flesh and in (the) <u>LORD</u>.</p> <p>17 So if you consider me your partner, receive him as you would receive me.</p> <p>18 If he has wronged you at all, or owes you anything, charge that to my account.</p> <p>19 I, Paul, write this with my own hand, I will repay it--to say nothing of your owing me even your own self.</p> <p>20a Yes, brother, I want some benefit from you in (the) <u>LORD</u>.
